Two Year Sequence:

Year two includes six modules focusing on career exploration with a guided vocational experience.

CSI students benefit from opportunities to:

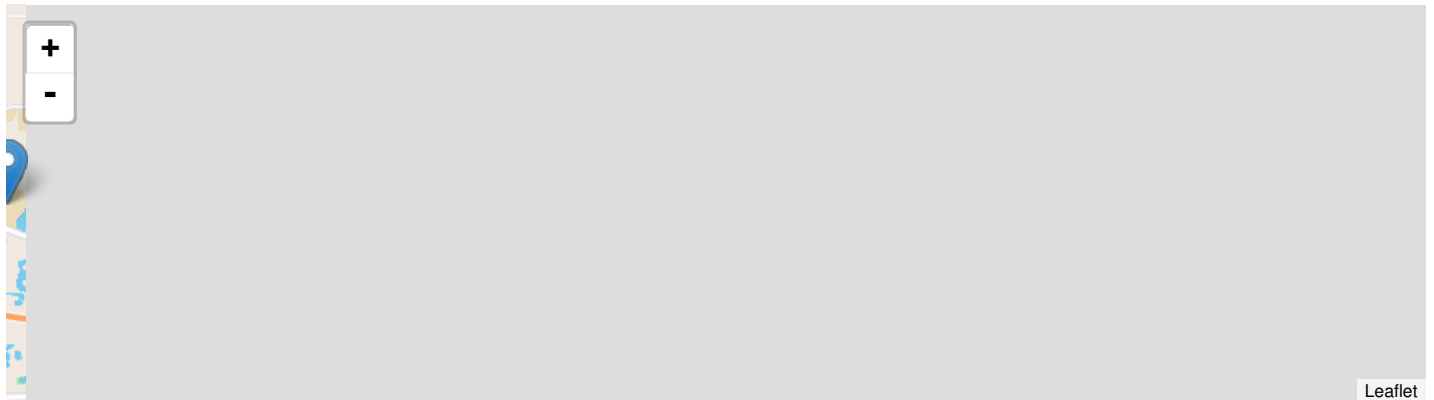
Develop academic, vocational, and social skills.
