

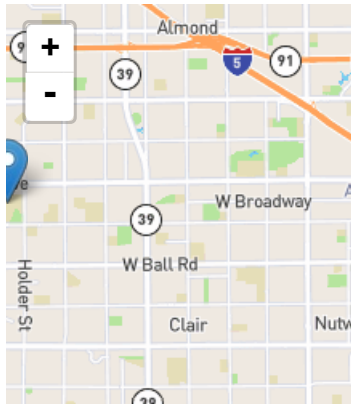
College to Career (North Orange) ^[1]
