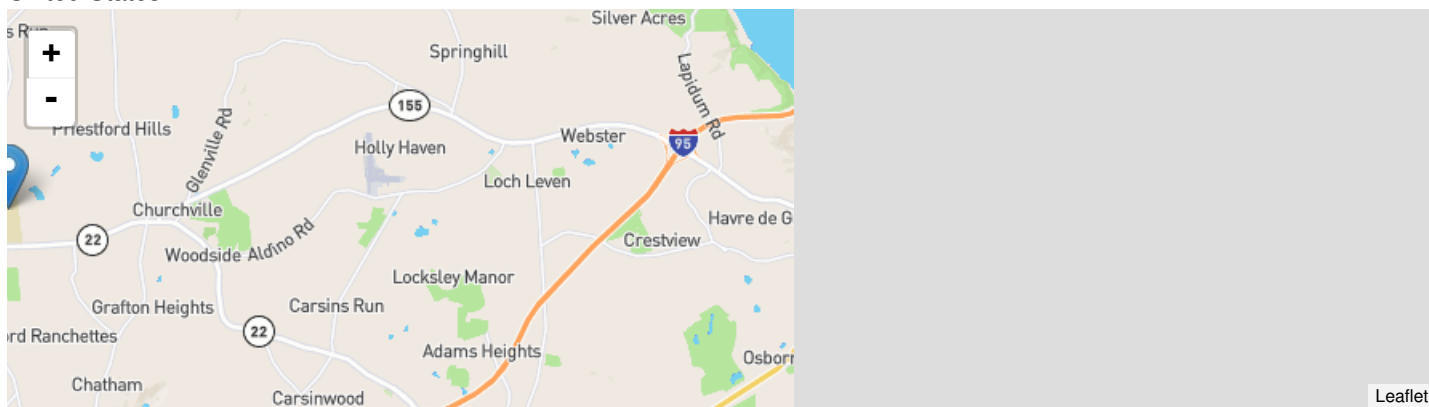


## Future Link <sup>[1]</sup>
