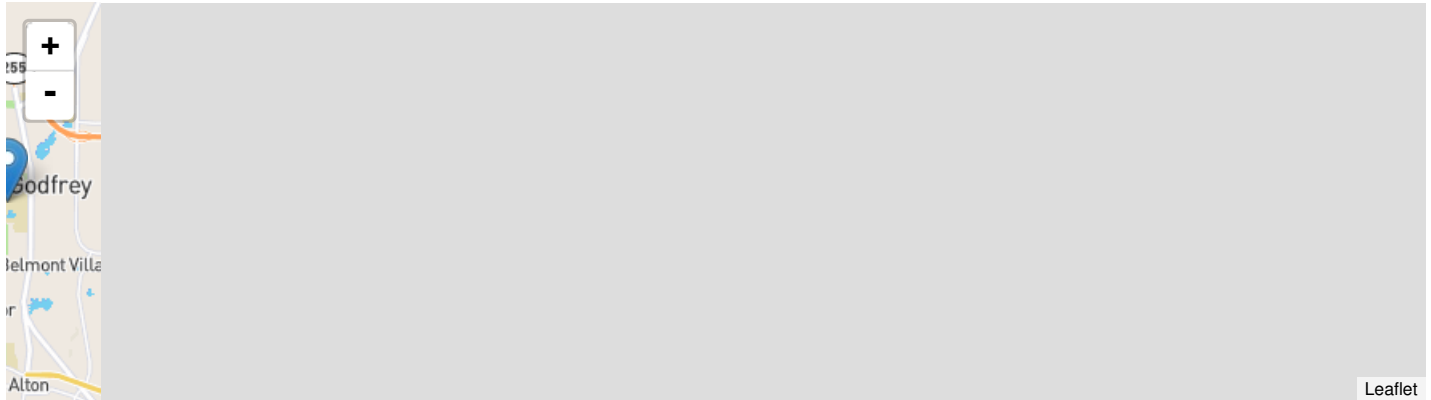


College for Life Programs ^[1]
