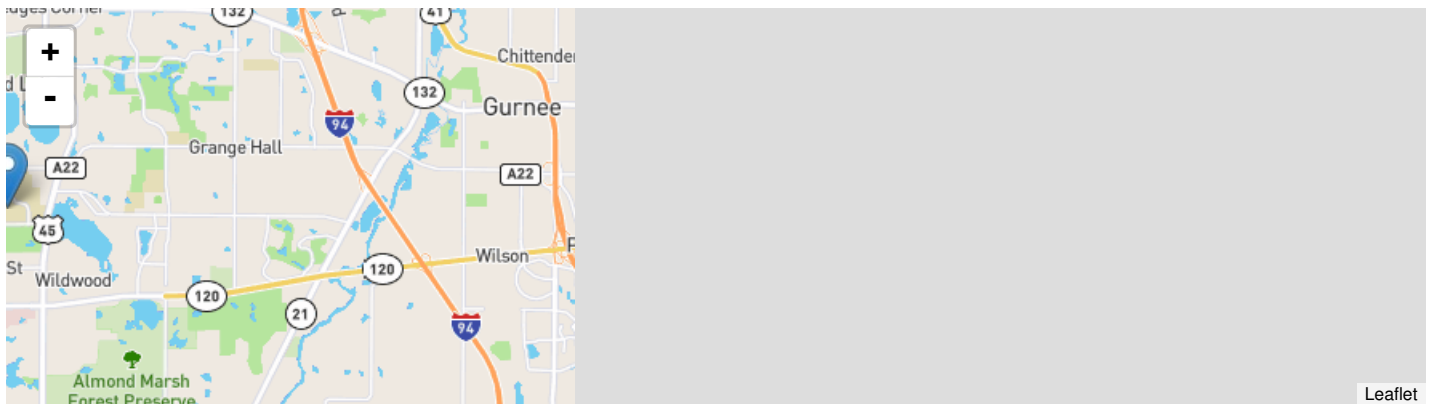


## **Personal Success Program** <sup>[1]</sup>

The Personal Success Program (PSP) offers a variety of vocational courses to meet the needs of students 18 years and older with mild to moderate cognitive impairment. The program's focus is on gaining skills that lead to entry-level employment. Each class is led by a content expert who has experience teaching individuals with disabilities. A special education teacher is also present in most classes to offer support to students. The curriculum is designed to be delivered at a level and pace that is appropriate to the needs of each student.
