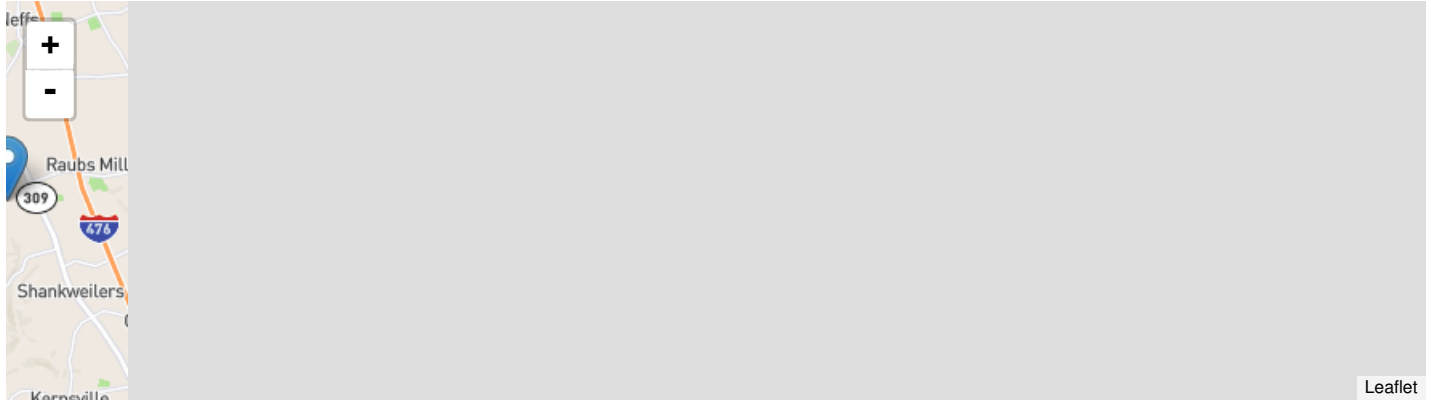


SEED [Success, Engagement, Education, Determination] ^[1]

LCCC SEED Summer Bridge gives participants a head start on preparing for the personal and academic demands of college and adult life. Participants have the support of coaches and mentors who will encourage them to discover more about their college and career goals. The Summer Bridge begins in July and is held over four weeks. Workshops address a range of topics from computers to notetaking, but the emphasis is on helping students develop well-rounded skills that can be used both inside and outside the classroom.
