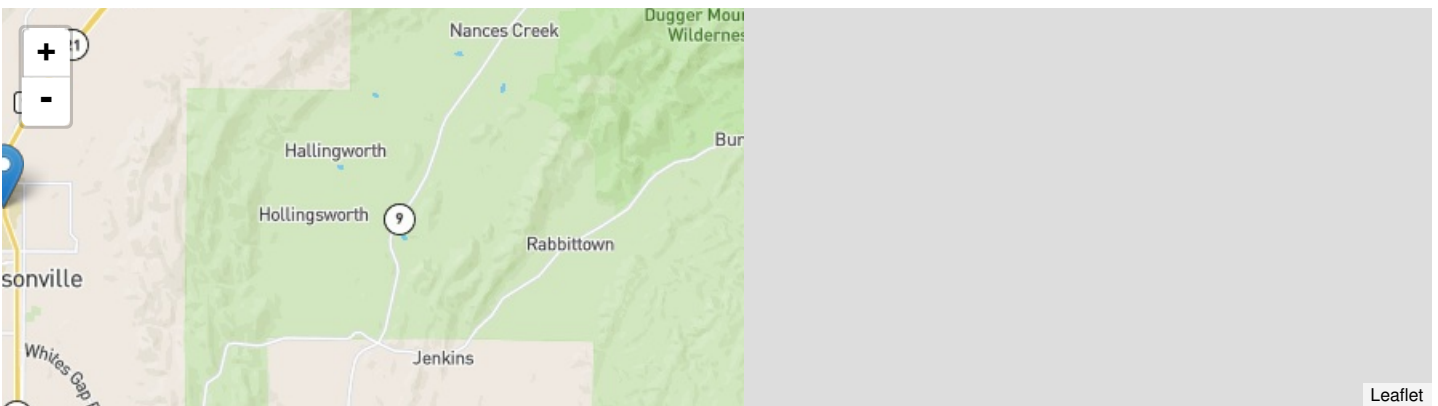


ON 2 JSU ^[1]

Jacksonville State University

Students who participate in On to JSU experience an individualized, person-centered program based on their individual interests and specific needs. Each student will participate in courses with traditional university students in order to build both social and academic skills. Students will work towards a certification in either Business Basics or Food Service through coursework and internship opportunities beginning as early as their second semester in the program. Certificate options for each On To JSU participant will be planned from existing JSU curriculum using a person-centered approach. In order to achieve the highest level of success for each student, the On To JSU Program Manager will meet individually with each student with ID to determine particular needs and preferences from among the offered courses each semester. The certificate programs are designed to be completed in a two year term of fall-spring; fall-spring semesters. A total of equivalency of 24 credit/noncredit hours will be planned over the four semesters of participation in On to JSU. The overall goal of On to JSU is to provide opportunities for students with intellectual disabilities with the needed skills; both socially and career-related that they traditionally have not been able to experience in this region of Alabama. Participants in On to JSU have the opportunity to live on campus and participate in a variety of on and off campus social activities. Special education collaborative teacher candidates will also work closely with On to JSU students as campus based peers, which will be mutually beneficial to both parties. Traditional student peers from other academic disciplines are recruited to build a vital support network on campus so that students with ID will have scaffolded support at each point in the process. On To JSU offers students with ID the opportunity to cultivate academic enrichment, social, and vocational skills while living on campus and participating in social activities, sporting events, and typical college life.
