Students are enrolled in 1-2 typical college courses per term offered by the university. In partnership with university professors and the CCS-TCIO academic coordinator, courses are taken for credit with a Pass/No Pass option and an individual learning plan (ILP) is developed with needed modifications to support learning of the course objectives. Some students may choose to take courses for a grade if they believe they can complete the course requirements without modifications.
