

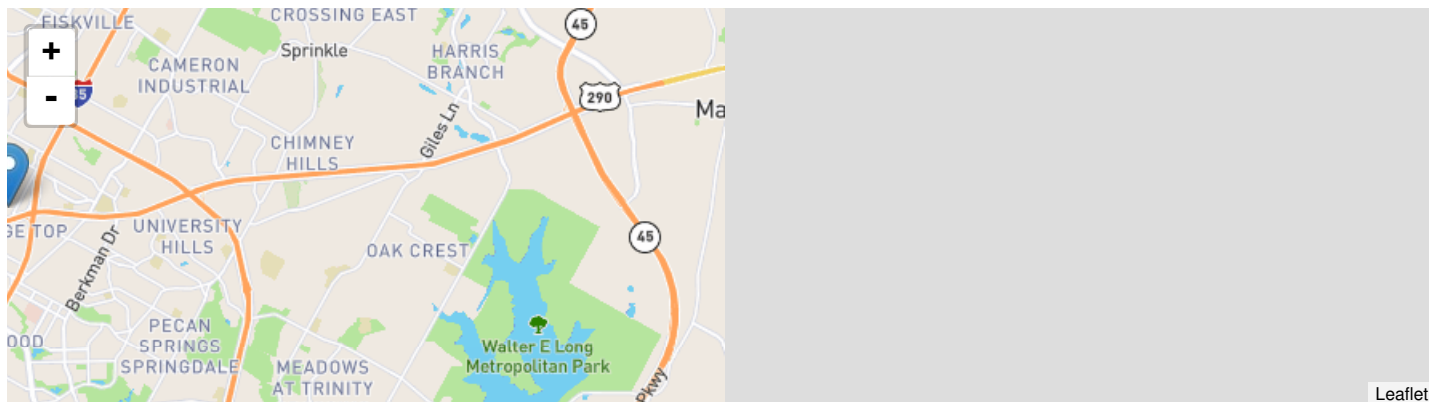
ACC STEPS ^[1]
