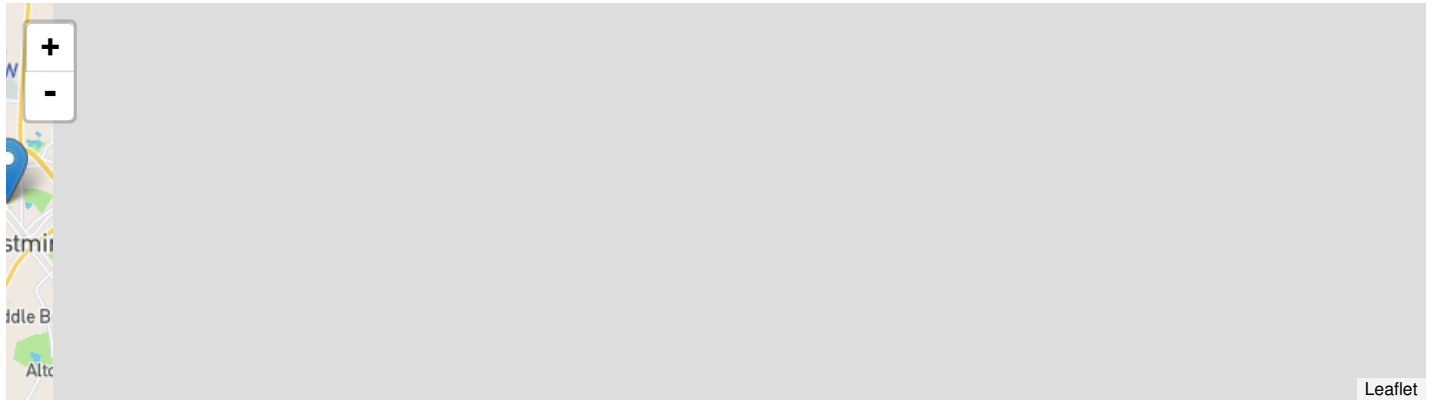
McDaniel College
