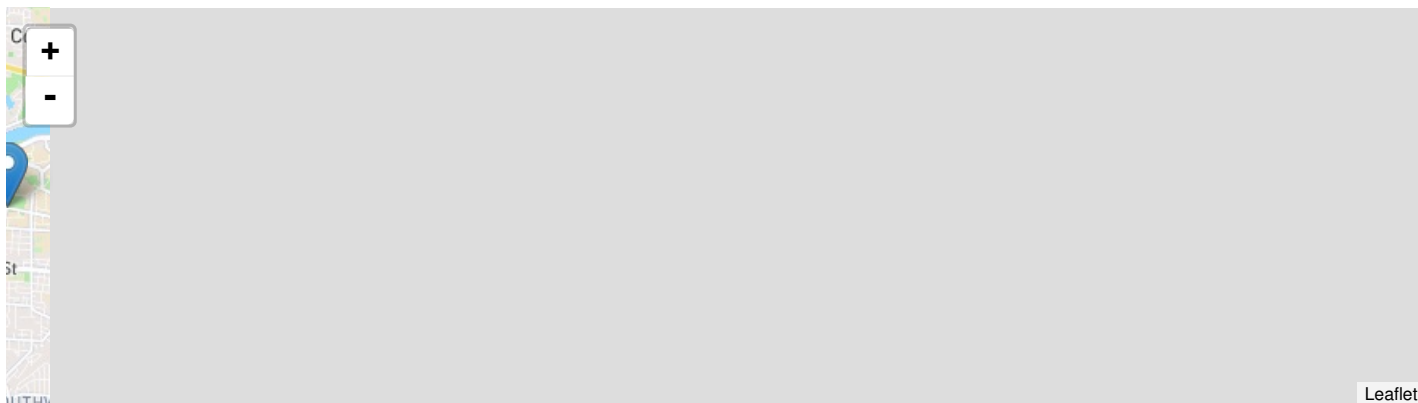


CrossingPoints Certificate in Occupational Studies ^[1]
