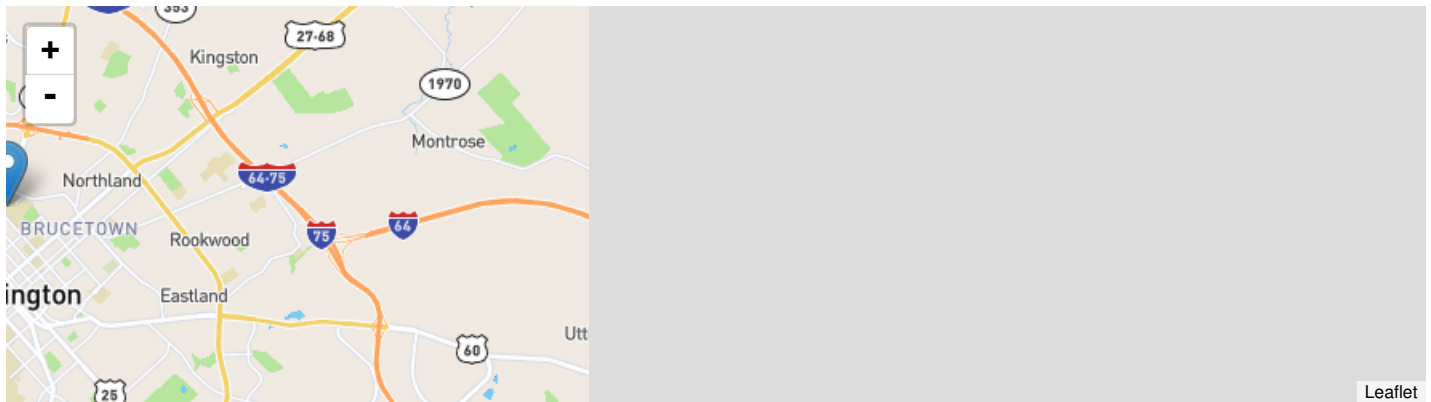


Comprehensive Transition & Postsecondary Program (CTP) ^[1]

Although this is a college program, it is not a 5 day program so students and families should know that this is not the same level of support as in high school, but that we strive to provide personalized supports to each student.
