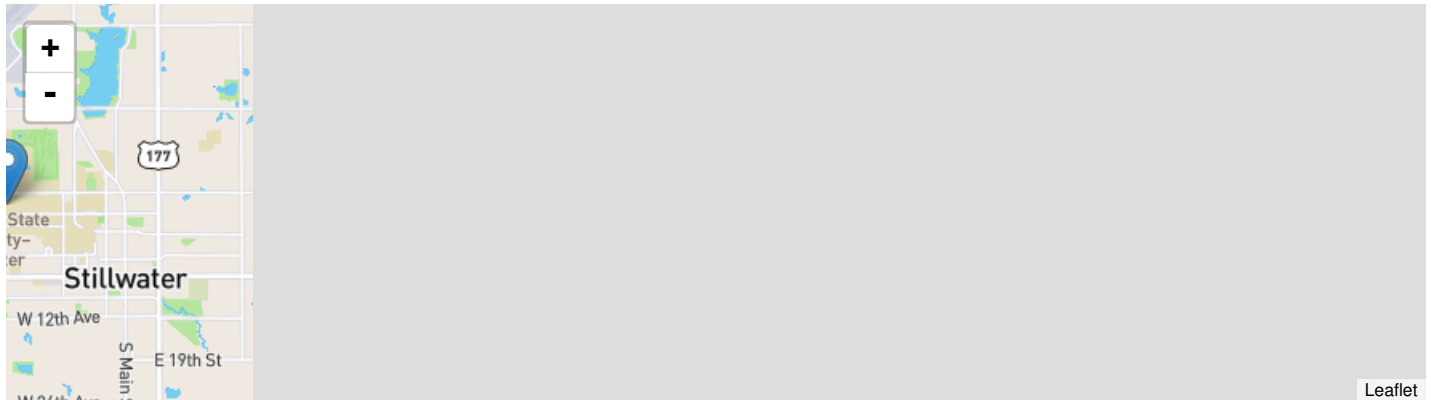


Opportunity Orange Scholars ^[1]

Oklahoma State University

Located on the Stillwater campus, Opportunity Orange Scholars (OOS) at Oklahoma State University (OSU) provides a unique, inclusive academic program for students with intellectual disability. With the aim of producing self-determined graduates, the full-time program challenges and supports students' personal and professional development as they live, learn, work and play on the OSU campus. Housed in the Department of Human Development and Family Science in the College of Education and Human Sciences, the two-year (four-semester) academic program provides learning opportunities and individualized supports across four program areas: 1) academic coursework, 2) on-campus living, 3) campus and community engagement, and 4) on- and off-campus employment. Graduates of the program earn a university-recognized certificate in Career and Community Studies as reflected on an official OSU Transcript.
