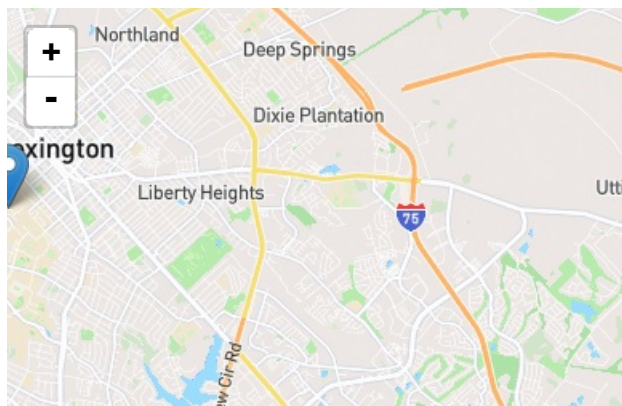


College and Career Studies ^[1]
