




Highlights of Annual Report of the Cohort 2 TPSID Model Demonstration Projects (Year 5, 2019–2020)

In 2019–20, 25 TPSID grantees operated...



58 programs at
 56 colleges and
 universities
 serving over
 956 students
 with IDD across
 19 states

34 TPSID programs were approved as Comprehensive Transition and Postsecondary (CTP) programs, allowing them to offer federal financial aid to eligible students.

EXIT OUTCOMES



79% of exiting students completed their program and earned a credential.

Paid employment rates at exit were drastically impacted by COVID - 19, dropping from 52% in 2018 - 19 to 21%

POST-EXIT OUTCOMES



59%* of those who completed a TPSID program had a paid job one year after exit vs. an employment rate of 19% of adults with DD in the general population. (*n=275)


92%* of former students report that they were satisfied or very satisfied with their social life. (*n=247)

66%* of respondents to a 2-year outcome survey had a paid job two years after completing a TPSID program. (*n=250)



The TPSID model demonstration program has demonstrated what is possible when high expectations are paired with expanded opportunities and sufficient resources.
